3. Approval of the December 2015 Minutes

The November 2015 Minutes were adopted on a motion by Kathrine Cargo (LaNENA) and seconded by Brad Mooney (DW&F).

4. Chair's Report: Chair Rusti Liner (LEPA) thanked everyone for attending the meeting and introduced Monica Mardel with the Census Bureau.

5. Presentation: CIMS - "Cemetery Management Software", by Brandon Finley with Ramaker and Associates. Mr. Finley described his work mapping gravesites in large cemeteries. He got started in 1998 in Wisconsin assisting municipal owned cemeteries track the location of graves. By 2003 his company was managing over 100 cemeteries with web based software that allowed clients to print out a map with the location of every grave. Some municipalities came to him after they had been involved in a scandal (not able to locate a body), and were forced to use a better system by a court or elected official. He now employs an ArcGIS Server application and most of his data is stored in the cloud.

6. 2016 Election of Officers

The LGISC Election Committee confirmed the nominations submitted for Chair and Vice Chair. A written ballot was distributed and the votes were counted. Rusti Liner (LEPA) was elected as our 2016 Chair and Warren Kron was elected as 2016 Vice Chair.

7. Old Business

The Addressing Resolution discussed at the December GIS Council Meeting was approved without opposition.

David Gisclair (Senate) noted that the Geographic Response Plan (GRP) for Calcasieu and Cameron are in progress. Local meetings were held in both parishes working on tactical protection of sites. In all, 3500 sites were identified in Cameron and lower Calcasieu.

8. New Business

Lynn Dupont (LAPDD) noted that St Bernard Parish hired Richard Poche (formerly of GCR Inc.) as their new GIS Manager in January.

Kevin Breaux (GOHSEP) noted that Virtual Louisiana is ingesting new data layers and new imagery. GOHSEP is now sharing a GIS position with DOTD.

Lynn Dupont noted that the American Community Survey, produced by the Census Bureau, has had to reduce the number of data layers collected and displayed by 60%.
